Health Insurance Options For Low-Income Households

What is Medicaid and Medi-Cal?

Medicaid

Medicaid offers government-funded health insurance to those at or below the poverty line nationwide. Qualifying households pay no/lower premiums, deductibles, and copays compared to private plans.

Medicaid benefits vary by state but many benefits like hospital, physician, and even transportation services, are required to be covered nationwide.

Medi-Cal

Medi-Cal is the name for California's Medicaid program and extends eligibility to households within 138% of the poverty line.

You will have a managed care health plan with specific in-network providers/ locations under Medi-Cal. Plan options vary by county, so be sure to notify your old or new county office if you move.

Do I Qualify For Medi-Cal?

Residency Status

Currently, to receive full Medi-Cal benefits, you must be a citizen, U.S. national, or an undocumented immigrant who is under 26, over 50, or is a DACA recipient. However, beginning in 2024, all undocumented immigrants will be eligible regardless of age.

Income Requirements

In 2023, a 1-person household would need a yearly income of \$18,755 or less to qualify for Medi-Cal. For a 4-person household, the income limit is \$38,295.

Exceptions

- If you are pregnant, blind, disabled, a temporary refugee, under the age of 21, or over 65, you may still qualify despite exceeding income limits.
- If you are enrolled in one of these programs, you can also qualify: CalFresh, SSI/SSP, CalWorks (AFDC), Refugee Assistance, Foster Care or Adoption Assistance Program

What is CHIP?

The Children's Health Insurance Plan (CHIP) provides low-cost health coverage to children in low-to-moderate income households, but earn too much to qualify for Medicaid.

Qualifying households pay no/lower premiums, deductibles, and copays compared to private plans. In some states, CHIP also covers health services for pregnant women.

Do I Qualify For CHIP?

Each state has its own requirements for qualification. However, if you apply for Medicaid, you can find out if your child qualifies for CHIP.

After filling out an application, a representative will contact you about your application. If your income is too high for Medi-Cal, you will also find out if you qualify for any Covered California "premium assistance" plans that can be lower in cost.
